



The longest skywalk in ASEAN, which is being constructed in Aiyoe Weng subdistrict, Betong district, Yala province, is scheduled to be officially opened in 2020.

Betong District Chief Officer Anand Boonsamran said that construction of the 91-million-baht skywalk is now 60 percent complete. The skywalk stretches about 61 meters from the cliff and is 2,038 feet above sea level.

He believes that it will attract more tourists to the three southern border provinces, namely Yala, Pattani, and Narathiwat. The skywalk will take visitors to appreciate the beautiful scenery of Betong, especially the Aiyoe Weng fantastic sea of clouds, which can be seen all year round.

The sea of clouds in Aiyoe Weng is being promoted as a new attraction in Yala. Betong district has developed several scenic viewpoints where visitors can appreciate the Aiyoe Weng mist.

Today, the sea of clouds in Aiyoe Weng has become a popular attraction among both Thai and foreign tourists, especially those from Malaysia.

Apart from Aiyoe Weng, there are also several tourist attractions nearby, such as the top of Khunung Silipat (Khunung Sali) hill, another a scenic viewpoint to watch the sea of clouds, as well as Na Ko hot spring, Na Ko waterfall, and Phaya Ngu cave.

Betong boasts many tourist sites, and local people has offered homestay services for visitors for more than 30 years now. Many food and coffee shops along roadsides are open for all tourists visiting this \"city of mist.
